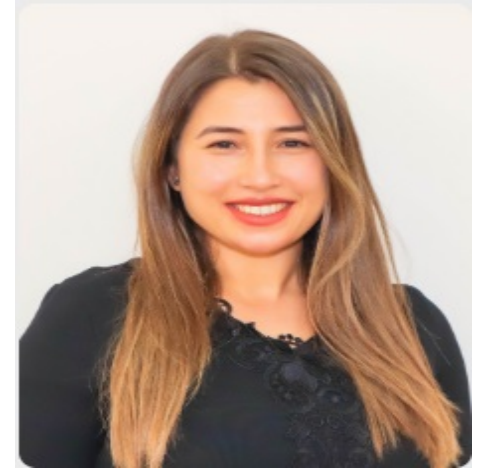

Program Overview

In pre-hospital settings, it is essential to provide emergency care and rescue services to ill or injured individuals, remain attentive and calm, assess their condition through effective communication, and administer the appropriate medical intervention. The aim of the First and Emergency Aid Program is to train healthcare technicians who can provide basic and advanced life support to patients and injured individuals within pre-hospital emergency medical services; identify existing and potential trauma and apply the appropriate emergency response; and ensure the safe transportation of patients or injured individuals who have received initial treatment to hospitals by ambulance. The curriculum consists of general foundation courses, professional courses in the field of first and emergency aid-such as Emergency Patient Care, Emergency Medical Services, Basic Life Support, Advanced Life Support, Pharmacology, Public Health, Anatomy, Physiology, Medical Terminology, Professional Ethics, and Professional Practice-as well as practical courses conducted in educational and healthcare institutions.

In addition to these foundation and professional courses, students may take elective courses included in our carefully designed curriculum in line with their interests and abilities. Through these courses, they can acquire not only the professional competencies required by the field but also a range of skills that they can use in their social lives, including entrepreneurship and teamwork.

With the diploma they receive upon graduation, our students may work in the emergency departments of public and private inpatient and outpatient healthcare institutions affiliated with the Ministry of Health, 112 Emergency Medical Service Stations, 112 Command and Control Centers, and private ambulance services.

They may also continue their education in bachelor's degree programs such as Emergency Aid and Disaster Management, Nursing, or Nursing and Health Services through the Vertical Transfer Examination.
